Philip R. Day, Jr.

Philip R. Day, Jr. is President and C.E.O. of NASFAA. Prior to assuming leadership of our national organization, Dr. Day served as Chancellor of City College of San Francisco. He also served as President of Daytona Beach Community College, Cape Cod Community College, and Dundalk Community College.



A Maine native, Dr. Day earned a bachelor's degree in Psychology from the University of Maine in Portland, a master of education in Counselor Education from State University of New York at Buffalo, and a doctorate in Adult and Higher Education from the University of Massachusetts in Amherst.

Day is a former member of the board of directors of the American Association of Community Colleges and of the American Council on Education. While on the board of AACC, he was founding Chair of the Commission on Workforce and Economic Development. He also served as a member of the National Advisory Council on Vocational Education, and as founding

President of the National Articulation and Transfer Network.

As NASFAA's first new president in more than 30 years, Philip Day is focused on re-establishing the organization's image as the premier advocacy group for student aid. Building on his experience and strength in government relations and advocacy, Dr. Day hopes to make NASFAA more proactive and involved in policy issues that impact student access to higher education.
