








Baseline data


- Spring 19 31 total Cal U students
- Fall 19 24 total Cal U students
- Only 5 students each year are receiving Chafee from each of these school years.





What happened...


- Anonymous Donor \$10,000
 - Supplies (living/educational), meetings
- In Fall 19, we have 6 new students
 - Two of the new students are actively participating

- Student #6 "the leader"








Building a Foundation

 - Chafee posters










New Ideas

- Intake Forms (medical benefits, food stamps, etc.)
- Advocates at NSO/Open Houses
 - Arranging for transportation when needed
- CWEL or more social work interns
- Build relationships with agencies
- Provide workshops to high school students through agencies (FAFSA, academic success, conduct focus groups)






New Ideas


- Winter and Summer Breaks
 - Help students identify work study positions
 - Identify "ambassadors" to have students stay at their homes
- Building a sense of community through gatherings
- Create a cap and gown loan program





Challenges

- Getting students to participate
- Year-round housing (food, safety)
 - winter or summer work study
- Students who've aged out
- ... "we'll just use existing resources."
