



Junior Achievement® Classroom Programs

JA Classroom Programs:

- Kit-based
- Volunteer-led
- K-12 students
- Financial literacy, career-readiness and entrepreneurial sessions
- Hands-on activities
- Five to eight, 30-55 minute classroom setting sessions





JA BizTown:

- 8,000 square foot mini-city where students experience how the “real world” works
- 5th or 6th grade students become JA BizTown “citizens” for the day where they work in one of 14 businesses and
 - manage their personal and business finances
 - develop and sell products
 - hold business meetings
 - pay taxes
 - donate to charity



Volunteering:

- Schools are responsible for recruiting the volunteers .
- A few schools do require community business volunteers
- Time: approximately a full-day





YES! Your Economic Success:

- Half-day program
- 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students
- Four activities per grade level
- Each activity - 30 minutes



Volunteering:

- Volunteer remains in the classroom and presents the same activity four times
- An average of 30 volunteers are needed during the morning hours

STEM Summit:

- Day-long program
- 9th-10th grade students
- Nine thirty-minute sessions
- Biology, chemistry, physics, civil engineering, math, manufacturing, and other modules



Volunteering:

- An average of 25 volunteers needed each day
- Volunteer time is approximately a full school day





REAL Life:

- A day-long program
- 11th or 12th grade students
- Importance of financial decisions and career readiness
- Budget Builder activity 1/2 day
- Career readiness activities 1/2 day



Volunteering:

- Up to 40 volunteers each day
- Needed for Budget Builder or one of four career readiness modules
- Volunteer time is approximately a full school day

- Virtual career fair for students
- Middle and high school grade levels
- Connects students to area businesses and organizations
- Open to students for extended period of time

- No live volunteer opportunities
 - Exhibitor

Digital programs have been developed to keep students engaged while volunteer-led programs are not available.






