NOTE: Space is limited; Registration is required. A Microsoft TEAMS link will be sent prior to the event.

The FAFSA asks for information about you and your financial situation. If you're married, you will need the same information for your spouse. If you're considered a dependent student, you will need your contributor's information, too.

Before filing the FAFSA, gather the following items:

- Your StudentAid.gov Account username and password.
NOTE: This may take time to process, so we recommend creating your account 4 days prior to filing the FAFSA. Visit StudentAid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch to create your account.
- Your Social Security number
- Your alien registration number, if you are not a U.S. citizen
- List of colleges or career schools you want to include on the FAFSA
- Name, date of birth, email address, and social security number of each contributor to the FAFSA
- Your 2023 tax documents and accompanying schedules
NOTE: If you complete your FAFSA online, you will automatically retrieve your income and tax data from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and have it transferred into your FAFSA. The Federal Student Aid Direct Data Exchange is the preferred method to complete the FAFSA.
- Your current bank statements and records of stocks, child support payments received, bonds, 529 plans, business and farm assets, and other investments including real estate (but not including the home in which you live)
- A personal email address (not a school email address)

PA State Grant Update

After careful review, **PHEAA has made the decision to step back from 2025-26 processing in GrantUs and leverage our legacy systems for all 2025-26 PA State Grant and special programs processing activities.** Our legacy system is the system we used prior to the new GrantUS system we released for the 2024-25 PA State Grant application. We anticipate this will take us several weeks and are targeting April 2025 to begin launching the 2025-26 award year.

In the meantime, please continue encouraging your students to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) as soon as possible as this is the first step towards eligibility across many of our programs. Once we launch the 2025-26 award year, students will receive an email instructing them how to access their account in the legacy system to complete the State Grant process. Over the coming months, we will continue to assess the impact this decision has on application deadlines and program processes across the PA State Grant Program and special programs. As further decisions are made about 2025-26, we will share program specific updates and resources with our program partners and students.

Grow PA Scholarship Grant (Grow PA Grant)

This program helps **in-state students** pay for school and builds the workforce for **in-demand occupations in PA**.

Up To \$5,000 Per Year

Awards are **first-come, first-served**, so don't delay— get the application at pheaa.org/GrowPA.

Apply for the Grow PA Grant If You Are...

A PA Resident Going to School in PA

- ▶ You must also complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®), maintain satisfactory academic progress for Title IV financial aid, and attend a qualifying school at least half-time. In addition, you cannot already hold a bachelor's degree.

Enrolled In a Qualifying Major or Program

- ▶ There are over 460 eligible programs of study or majors that lead to in-demand occupations in a variety of fields, such as agriculture, business, education, computer science, STEM, nursing, allied health, and criminal justice.

Committed to Work an In-Demand Job in PA

- ▶ Grow PA Grant recipients **must live and work in PA** in their approved occupation after graduation.

REMINDER: If you do not complete the work requirement, you must repay the Grow PA Grant as a loan.
