Inclusive Postsecondary Education (IPSE)

College programs for students with intellectual disabilities

- Focus on academics, socialization, employment, and independent living
- 350+ IPSE programs across the country
- Large variety across programs
 - 2 year, 4 year, and trade schools
 - Public and private universities
 - Level of inclusion
 - Residential vs non residential

Why should students with IDD go to college?

Educational Disparities

69.7% of students without IDD go on to post-secondary education

28.7% of students with IDD go on to post-secondary education

Employment Disparities

65.7% of people without IDD are working

18.7% of people with IDD are working

Social Disparities

People without IDD have an average of **125** social connections

People with IDD have an average of **3.1** social connections

RISE Program Mission

To provide supported pathways for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities to earn a college credential and seamlessly transition into sustainable employment and independent living.



RISE

An inclusive postsecondary education opportunity for college students with intellectual and developmental disabilities

- 2 year program
- Integrated Studies Certificate
- Fully inclusive
- Employment-focused



Academics

- 3 courses per semester
 - Technical training course (for credit)
 - Career readiness course (for credit)
 - General education course (for credit or for audit)
- No requirements for placement assessment
- No English or Math courses required
- Courses are primarily on-campus, not online
- All courses are fully inclusive



Academics - Career Pathways

- Students select a career pathway at the beginning of the program:
 - Baking and Pastry
 - Culinary Arts
 - Early Childhood Education
 - Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning
 - Office Technology
 - Plumbing
 - Security Professional
 - Social Work



Other Program Areas

Social

- Students are required to participate in at least four campus events per semester and are encouraged to join a student club

Career

- Students build job skills and technical knowledge throughout their courses, time on campus, and work based learning opportunities
- Career Connections Center

Independent Living

- Time management, money management, communication, self-advocacy, problem solving, self-determination



SUPPORTS

Campus Supports

- Tutoring
- Academic advising
- Library services
- Disability services
- Counselors
- Career connections
- Student life



RISE Supports

- Structured study lounge
 - Minimum of 4 hours per week
- Academic coaching
 - 1 hour per week
- Peer mentors
- Requirement to meet with professors throughout the semester
- Midterm feedback opportunities

Fall 2025 Recap

- First semester with students
- 8 students enrolled
- 10 unique courses taken
- 58 credits taken
- 100% of courses passed
- 860+ hours completed in the RISE lounge
- 27+ campus events attended
- 2 students passed the ServSafe Manager Exam

SUPPORTING STUDENTS WITH IDD TO ATTEND COLLEGE

K-12 Educators and Counselors

- Talk to students with IDD about college
- Schedule visits to IPSE programs
- Add postsecondary education as an IEP transition goal
- Provide students with opportunities to gain independence and self-determination
 - Decision-making
 - Time management
 - Self-advocacy



Post-Secondary Educators

- Consider starting an IPSE program
- Incorporate Universal Design for Learning (UDL) into your classroom
- Focus on increasing accessibility across campus
- Promote collaboration amongst campus departments
